

Who is eligible for AW2?

Soldiers who qualify for AW2 are assigned to the program as soon as possible after arriving at the [Warrior Transition Unit \(WTU\)](#). In order to be considered eligible for entry into AW2, Soldiers must have suffered from wounds, illness, or injuries incurred in the line of duty (LOD) after September 10, 2001 and received, or are expected to receive at least a 30 percent Army disability rating from the Integrated Disability Evaluation System (IDES) for one of the following conditions:

- a. Blindness or loss of vision
- b. Loss of limb
- c. Hearing loss/deafness
- d. Burns or permanent disfigurement
- e. Paralysis/spinal cord injury
- f. Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)
- g. Fatal *and* incurable disease with limited life expectancy less than a year

-OR-

- h. Receive a 30 percent IDES (Army) Disability Rating for any other Combat Related Condition or condition caused by an instrumentality of war, including Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and other Behavioral Health (BH) conditions (answering yes on DA Form 199 to V1/V3)

-OR-

- i. Receive a *combined* 50 percent IDES (Army) Disability Rating for any other Combat Related Conditions or conditions caused by instrumentality of war (answering yes on DA Form 199 to V1/V3)

How do AW2 Advocates interact with the WTU?

Eligible Soldiers are assigned to an Advocate as soon as possible upon arriving at a WTU. The Advocate is closely integrated with the Soldier's triad of care and interdisciplinary team on all aspects of the Soldier's Comprehensive Transition Plan ([CTP](#)) and attends all Focus Transition Review (FTR) meetings.
